Scanning and Remembering: Learning about job resources Go over these ideas orally with your class.

- Pose a question like this one, " Do you read signs in English when you ride the bus, or wait in an office? How about signs at school or at work? Have you ever learned something important from a sign on the street? (Free, Apt for Rent, Help Wanted, etc"
- There is a lot of useful info posted on signs, on buses, on street corners, on bulletin boards, in schools! Especially when we are looking for a job, it's helpful to look around all the time.
- 3. We don't always have time to write, or a pencil handy.
- 4. We can remember more with practice. We can come back later to look again if we notice and read, in the first place.
- 5. Encourage them to understand for themselves if they are someone who "has to write it down" or if they can remember dates, addresses, etc fairly well without writing. We are very different this way.

Skimming practice.

- 1. Use an OHP of current info from MHH or SOMEC. Fall 2007 fliers are included and could be used in later semesters.
- 2. Have ss skim, but not write notes. Give 1-2 minutes.
- 3. Turn off OHP.
- 4. Immediately have them take a pencil, number 1-5 on paper.
- 5. Read to them, they mark true or false.
- 6. Compare with a partner.
- 7. Turn OHP back on.
- 8. Correct together.

Variation. Do the same thing but space the "remembering" between the beginning and end of class, or even one day and the next.
