- 8. Save your spreadsheet often.
- 9. Find the total. Use the formula for sum.
- 10. Save again.
- 11. Make a pie chart for her expenses. Use the Insert tab. Follow the steps we learned in our m&m's lesson. Help each other find the pie charts.
