# Safety Requirement Sources

- Communications system




#### Infrastructure Requirements

- Weather conditions
- Terrain
- Vehicle traffic on public streets

- Light levels
- Site space
- Exposures



#### Environmental Laws and Codes

Instructors must provide training within the limitations of national, state/provincial, local environmental laws, building and fire codes, and zoning ordinances



- No matter where the training, access must be considered
- Especially important when units remain in-service during the training
- Whenever possible, provide at least two means of access
